## **Cossall Canal Walk**



#### **Features:**

Cossall is a picturesque, relatively unspoiled village on the Nottingham canal, four miles south-east of Eastwood.

- Architecturally interesting. See St. Catherine's church and church cottage as featured in DH Lawrence's The Rainbow and home of Lawrence's fiancée.
- Canal towpath with many wild flower species and a haven for butterflies, dragonflies and damselflies.

## **Opening Times:**

This route-based canal walk has open access

#### Location:

- Main car park is on Dead Lane.
  O.S. Street Atlas ref: page 170, B4. 158 B1.
- Buses: telephone the traveline: on 0870 608 2608

### Paths and gates:

- Paths along the canal are compacted stone (B) and are mostly level except for one section to the north which is steeper.
- The walk along the canal is accessible by wheelchairs and scooters but stiles and steps restrict access to the village.
- There is a car park in the village, which is accessible, but beware of sharp bends in the road. Some pavements stop abruptly.
- Gates are marked with a (G)
- Cossall is linked to another Break Free 2 route at Trowell, however the link is not suitable for wheelchairs.

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
