

Outdoor and Environmental Education Privacy Notice

Introduction

This privacy notice explains how the Council uses your data to communicate with you regarding your booking/enquiry or advice concerning off-site visits. We do not collect personal information about you when you contact us or visit our website - except for cookies - unless you expressly choose to provide it to us, so you can take advantage of a specific service. For example, completing a form, signing up to receive email updates or making a booking online, by phone, post, or in person. We only collect and use information required to fulfil the services provided to you.

Who will be using your data?

Nottinghamshire County Council will be the data controller for the data you provide to

We may also contract third party organisations to process your data on our behalf.

What personal data do we use?

- Name and Contact Details
- Age
- Date of Birth
- Gender
- Images
- Address
- Parent/carer details
- Emergency contacts

What types of special category personal data do we need from you?

- Physical disability
- Special educational need (SEN)
- Medical information
- Dietary requirement

Why do we use your data?

- To identify your booking/enquiry
- For service planning, training and improvement
- To provide statutory off-site visits advice
- To communicate with you regarding your booking/enquiry
- To allow us to plan appropriate staffing, accommodation
- To communicate with a nominated person in case of an emergency whilst you are visiting
- To help us plan relevant assistance for delivering a service

What legal reasons allow us to use your data in this way?

Our legal basis for processing your personal data is that it is necessary to perform our public tasks as a local authority, or consent.

Our legal basis for processing your special category personal data is explicit consent.

Our legal basis is supported by the following legislation (but not limited to):

- Health and Safety Act 1974
- The Children Act 2004
- The Children and Families act 2014
- Local Government Act 1972, section 111 which provides that Nottinghamshire County Council is able to do anything which is calculated to facilitate, or is conducive or incidental to, the discharge of any of its functions

Who may we share your data with or receive it from?

- Schools & Academies
- Youth Services
- Parents, carers and guardians
- We use a third-party organisation to store personal information to help deliver our services to you.

May personal data be transferred overseas?

The Council may for operational purposes transfer personal data overseas. In these cases, we will ensure that your personal data is protected and there are safeguards for the protection of your rights. Please refer to the Council's privacy statement for further details.

How long is your data kept for?

This information is held in accordance with the Council's retention schedule – see <u>here.</u>

What will happen if you do not provide or we cannot obtain the data needed?

- We could not guarantee that the activities we provide are appropriate for the child / young person taking part.
- We could not ensure that the advice we provide for off-site visits is accurate and fit for purpose to ensure health and safety standards are maintained.

Does the service make decisions using fully automated processes?

What rights do you have over this use of your data?

- To be informed about how we use your data
- To access a copy of your data that we process
- To have us rectify or correct your data that we process
- To restrict our processing of your personal data
- To object to the use of your data

- To have your personal data erased
- To request that we transfer your information to you or another organisation
- To object to fully automated decision making
- To withdraw your consent (if it the legal reason why we use your data).
